### IV-1. CJUS 5170 - Vulnerable Populations in Criminal Justice

**Description:** This course is designed to explore criminal justice populations that require a unique approach for management and treatment. Specifically, students will be introduced to policing and corrections evidence-based practices to better serve the youth, elderly, females, LGBTQ+, offenders with disabilities, as well as individuals responsible for committing unique crime types, such as sex offenses and domestic violence.

# IV-2. <u>CJUS 5720 - Crime over the Life C</u>ourse

**Description:** Seminar is designed to provide an intensive examination of crime and the life course. Life course examined as a theoretical orientation, a research methodology, and as an empirical field of study with special reference to crime and deviance. Key conceptual and research issues analyzed and discussed including the development of criminal and deviant behavior and criminal/deviant careers; stability and change in criminal/deviant behavior across developmental stages of the life course; trajectories, transitions, and turning points through life; quantitative and qualitative approaches to studying crime and the life course; and how evidence from this field can be used to inform criminal justice policy and practice.

- the "validations methods course" required for the degree is to be included in the 12 hours of course work required for the student's chosen concentration.
- the elective course options will not include a course chosen from the degree's core courses, as all of the listed core courses are required for the degree.

## X-33. Data Engineering, MS - requirements clarification (Requested exception yr.: 2025-26)

**Description:** The biomedical engineering concentration in the Data Engineering, MS was recently approved (<a href="https://unt.curriculog.com/proposal:16051/form">https://unt.curriculog.com/proposal:16051/form</a>) with a small error in the number of allowed unrestricted BMEN courses that may be used for elective course work. The biomedical engineering concentration section on the program should show that
