| III. | Online curriculum and the role of CLEAR (Rudi Thompson) | There are a lot of misconceptions and CLEAR would like to address any questions Is CLEAR going to help with Alt-text Yes There are many open access services out there You can also speak with an accessibility person to help CLEAR is going to make sure all websites have the same and most up to date information They will link with colleges and the graduate school Rudi Thompson's class failed the CLEAR review the first time VP Adam Fine has hired an accessibility person, a budget person, and a communication person The communication will help everyone convey the same message about online learning Involvement of faculty in the direction of CLEAR Rudi feels like she represents faculty and is an inside person in CLEAR Some people will always say this person is faculty and this person is not At certain times VP Fine did not realize some people were not considered faculty, but he is very open to increasing representation Review of classes VP Fine misunderstood and thought this was already discussed with the Senate Mis-information is rampant They are in the process of hirring a Juris Doctor (JD) to be a compliance officer CLEAR has to make sure things are accessible They have currently reviewed classes that they know will be offered, but are in the process of 'finding' missing classes. This is why the reviews have slowed There will be accessibility help in Canvas You can use the 'course in a box' and it will have it built in that already has all the accessibility and legalese There are training modules in CLEAR You have to take the modules and once you do, you will be allowed to start building your course There will be a review part way through design to catch any big errors It will also go through a compliance review There is also a method where CLEAR designs the whole course and then the faculty reviews it after This method takes about a year Can you withdraw a course if you leave? |
