| III. | FY21 budget updates (President Neal Smatresk / Provost Jennifer Cowley / Vice President Bob Brown) | Bob Brown: Presented update on latest models for FY 21. Despite estimated loss of a little over \$40 million, lost revenues for summer leasing, loss of auxiliary funds, and cost of COVID, Brown is comfortable that university community will end the year where we need to be. His office has worked hard to contact at risk students—1,800—to assist them in making payment plans for payment of fees and tuition. Enrollment is up slightly; however, we are flat or about even as numbers are down from last year this time. Around 60% of our students are currently taking online/remote courses. Expenses are down somewhat with hiring freeze and 5% reduction of fiscal year budget. Depending on enrollment and state funding, further cuts are pending. |
| | | Provost: Depending on next budget cuts, there is a possibility of furloughs—worst case scenario. We have met markers, thus far, but the end of this week will be critical (extended time for students to make payments). |
| | | President: We are in better shape than most institutions and better shape than peer institutions. Immediate news is better than hoped, but long term news of fewer transfer students and fewer First Time In College (FTIC) students is real, and we will need to address these challenges. |
| | | Provost: Graduate Programs: Graduate Program numbers are up; however, we have challenges with our international graduate student population. Presently, we have 100 remote start with some students coming in January 2021. |
| | | Provost: CANVAS question—outages—program error due to CANVAS running updates. Content is recoverable. Adam Fein to provide for faculty, generally; please share with faculty. |
| | | Provost: If campus or county experiences more COVID cases, what is the plan? Unless the state closes institutions, we will not have a closing. With more activity occurring on campus, if we should see an increase in cases, the university will begin to remove a small number of classes, first. Clinical classes that require student face-to-face activity would be last. That is, there would not be a general announcement of a closing; instead, faculty would be contacted individually if we feel we need to "thin" the campus. |
| XI. | COVID-19 Testing and Tracking update (Elizabeth With) | With: University has in place testing and quarantine program. University health center has been offering tests ("rapid test") to symptomatic students since July 6, 2020. Baseline testing of 582 students in the dorms was conducted with 1 positive. Housing will be conducting "random testing" in order to continue to build a "baseline." There is a contact tracing program in place—testing, quarantine, and isolation—with students, faculty, and staff of the contact group for contact tracing to be tested for free. However, health care center does not accept insurance because the health care center is a "clinic," so it cannot test persons who simply want a test using insurance. |

| | | COVID Dashboard: https://healthalerts.unt.edu/return/cases With: Steps taken for students—1) working to educate students through CANVAS; 2) notified students returning to campus to monitor themselves before returning to campus; 3) provided training for resident advisors. With: Question on Groups—there will be "pods" of students who live in same wings of 25-30 students who are assigned the same color wrist bands. Consequently, there will be groups of students on campus, and faculty, staff, and students should not be alarmed. With: Question on Testing of Greeks—if Greek organization request testing, yes, health care center can test. There are no scheduled events this semester. President: All fall sports moved to Spring 2021. Football only in Fall 2020. Testing of athletes—NCAA guidelines, test all twice per week. Our concern is to guarantee that althletes will be safe. Marching band in stands. Provost: We watch the CDC and make changes based on what the CDC recommends that is driven by the science. |
