III.	Faculty Discussion (President Neal Smatresk / Provost Jennifer Cowley)	Effects of Harvey on the university Almost all students have returned. A few are still out on National Guard Duty. We had 8 transfer students come in, and only around 40 greatly impacted We helped them all as we could with small funds and catching them up in class Our overall campus response was effective and this situation provided UNT a good exercise in emergency preparedness Kuehne Lecture Series What is the process for selecting a speaker It is a donor advised operation The donors are influential people They look at who might draw a crowd In this case, someone knew Donald Trump Jr. and that same person is also paying his fee This series raises money for National Merit Scholars and funds quite a few Some of the donors do not feel the same way the average Dentonite does, but they are still big supporters of UNT and its programs UNT is in talks with a balanced speaker: Chelsea Clinton This will reach a very different group UNT will also use this opportunity to raise money As a Tier I institution, we have to be open to hearing a diversity of viewpoints Announcements

- Faculty Compensation study has started
 - People involved come from all over campus, including the Faculty Salary Study Committee of the Faculty Senate
- UNT hit an enrollment record
 - **38,115** students
 - This is the 3rd or 4th year in a row of increased enrollment
- UNT also set a record for number of National Merit Scholars
 - We have 54 or 55 and that puts us in 4th place in the state
 - If we keep this up next year, we will move ahead of UT
- o UNT funded 101 new Doctoral lines
- o Masters enrollment is still down
- o UNT is are out partnering in the international market
 - In China we are paring with their official National Online Education Program
- o DACA
 - It is still uncertain what will happened
 - We will take care of these students in the mean time
- Upcoming Town Hall Meetings
 - We want faculty involved in upcoming projects, specifically with our Net Dragon partnership
 - These town halls will allow us to design a digital campus that will be easy to use
 - Once we build this software, we will sell it to others
 - Because of this we really want to put out a good product and have a lot of input on the design
- o TAMS
 - UTD pulls TAMS students because they can offer more scholarships and have a STEM reputation
 - We want to improve TAMS and are doing some market testing in the next couple of years
 - This year we are raising tuition, but still keeping it a good deal in comparison to other private HS
 - Next year, we want to switch the focus from STEM to STEAM and change the "A" in TAMS to stand for Arts
 - maybe improving mentoring to help retain students

	 UTD also gives HS students opportunities to come and conduct research.
