## **Provost Cowley**

Budget

President Smatresk has put in budget for a 2% merit raise for 2021-2022. There is no allowance for broad market adjustments—stay tuned; this is on the "wish list"; once we reach some type of normalcy, will perform market analysis.

Summer OCR summer grants (Summer 2021) are available—March 16, 2021, application deadline with additional funds available.

Vice Provost of Faculty Success—search underway (internal and external candidates)—hope to bring someone on board Summer 2021 or Fall 2021.

Required faculty trainings

Sequence and Timing—Simmons, Compliance Officer, to review so that all trainings do not occur at the same time and occur throughout year. Loss of e-mail, loss of merit raises—next merit raise 2021-2022, anticipating that all faculty will have completed the mandatory anti-bias/cultural awareness training, and if faculty had not completed that training that they would be ineligible for merit raises.
